Although COVID-19 impacted his ability to work in the community, he was able to work through it. As his favorite saying goes, "It's OK. It's just different."



At school, London has taken many classes. Some of his favorites were Plant Science and Floral Design with Ms. Pepperd. She enjoyed working with him too, sharing that "London is an absolute delight to have as a student in the classroom, and to have as a member of the school community! His positivity is infectious, and his smile will always light up a room. There is not a single person that I know that does not immediately develop a smile once they hear London's name." 


We would like to take a moment to acknowledge one of our own donations from the Richmond School garden.
