



Subject: Formal Request for Extension of Audit – Fiscal Year 22 for Chariho

On behalf of the Chariho Regional School District I, Ned Draper, request an extension to the legal deadline for submission of the FY22 audit. It is our expectation to deliver the audit by January 31, 2023.

This request has been shared with our auditor Marcum LLP and in cooperation with Ben Wilkinson and Jim Wilkinson of their office.

The reason we are requesting the extension is:

- Final entries are still being made and are expected completed by the end of November
- It will take approximately 45 days thereafter to finalize reports, entries and provide adequate review time for the School Audit Committee and full School Committee prior to final audit submission
- GASB 75 reports are in progress and are also anticipated in hand by the end of November
- Our Assistant Director of Finance and Administration (former) Gail Wilcox departed Chariho to take a leadership position at North Kingstown School Department effective 7/1/2022. She continues to assist Chariho as possible.
- Our new Assistant Director of Finance and Administration (current) Jodi Brock officially began with Chariho effective 9/1/2022
- Both Assistant Directors work individually and as a team to complete reports in a timely manner. In particular, Gail’s schedule has significant demands due to the unique financial systems at each district and demands of her new position.
- The transition work noted above is anticipated to be resolved by January of 2023

Corrective Action Plan:

- We anticipate the transition teamwork underway will largely conclude the possibility of any future delays. We anticipate financial/accounting operations will be on routine schedule effective February 1, 2023 and thereafter.






DISPOSAL OF SCHOOL PROPERTY

1. In accord with the Chariho Act, the Superintendent shall, at least every five years, arrange for a public sale to dispose of all excess/outdated district properties whose itemized value is less than \$5,000. A list of items shall be provided to the School Committee in advance of disposal. Proceeds from such sale or disposal shall be deposited in the general fund.
2. Disposal of items valued at \$5,000 or more shall be by public invitation to bid. Failure to receive bids, duly advertised, shall cause such items to be disposed of by the Superintendent in an appropriate manner consistent with paragraph one of this policy.
3. For the purpose of selling items in a manner other than that described in paragraph one that are valued at less than \$5,000 and no longer being utilized by the District, sealed price quotes may be obtained via the use of Craigslist.

apron on. This meal fosters meaningful and lasting relationships within the school community, for all involved". This event is made possible, in part, by PTO funding.

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
